## Criteria-Based Consultation Prescribing Program CRITERIA FOR DRUG COVERAGE

## **Eslicarbazepine (Aptiom)**

## Notes:

- Quantity Limits: Yes
- Antiepileptic medications for treatment of partial (focal) onset seizures include: levetiracetam, carbamazepine, lamotrigine, oxcarbazepine, valproic acid product, felbamate, gabapentin, phenytoin, pregabalin, topiramate, valproate, zonisamide, lacosamide

Initiation (new start) criteria, and criteria for current Kaiser Permanente members already taking the medication who have not been reviewed previously: Nonformulary eslicarbazepine (Aptiom) will be covered on the prescription drug benefit for 12 months when the following criteria are met:

- Prescribed by a neurologist
- Patient has a diagnosis of partial-onset (focal) seizures
- Patient has failed an adequate trial of, or has contraindications to at least five other antiepileptic medications

<u>Criteria for new members entering Kaiser Permanente already taking the medication who have not been reviewed previously</u>: Non-formulary eslicarbazepine (Aptiom) will be covered on the prescription drug benefit for <u>12 months</u> when the following criteria are met:

- Patient has a diagnosis of partial-onset (focal) seizures
- Patient has failed an adequate trial of, or has contraindications to at least five other antiepileptic medications

<u>Continued use criteria for patients previously approved per the above criteria who are currently stable on the medication</u>: Non-formulary eslicarbazepine (Aptiom) will continue to be covered on the prescription drug benefit for <u>12 months</u> when the following criteria are met:

- Continues to be prescribed by a neurologist
- Sustained improvement in seizure control (frequency and/or severity) since starting eslicarbazepine as documented by neurologist

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
