

# Criteria-Based Consultation Prescribing Program

## CRITERIA FOR DRUG COVERAGE

### Frovatriptan (generic Frova)

#### Notes:

^ Adequate trial is defined as use in at least 3 migraine episodes

\* Intolerance excludes adverse drug reactions that are expected, mild in nature, resolve with continued treatment, and do not require medication discontinuation

**Initiation (new start) criteria and criteria for current Kaiser Permanente members already taking the medication who have not been reviewed previously:** Non-formulary frovatriptan (generic Frova) will be covered on the prescription drug benefit when the following criteria are met:

- Prescribed for the treatment of Migraine
  - Patient is 18 years old or older **OR**
  - Patient is younger than 18 years old and prescriber is Neurologist/Headache specialist or case is reviewed with specialist
  - Patient does not have hemiplegic migraine or basilar migraines
  - Patient has failed an adequate trial<sup>^</sup> of or patient has an allergy or intolerance\* to naratriptan, sumatriptan, and rizatriptan

#### **-OR-**

- Prescribed for the treatment Menstrual Migraine
  - Patient 18 years old or older **OR**
  - Patient is younger than 18 years old and prescriber is Neurologist/Headache specialist or case is reviewed with specialist
  - Patient does not have hemiplegic migraine or basilar migraines
  - Patient has failed an adequate trial<sup>^</sup> of or patient has an allergy or intolerance\* to NSAID (e.g. naproxen) and naratriptan used as peri-menstrual prophylaxis

**Criteria for new members entering Kaiser Permanente already taking the medication who have not been reviewed previously:** Non-formulary frovatriptan (generic Frova) will be covered on the prescription drug benefit for when the following criteria are met:

- Diagnosis of Migraine or Menstrual Migraine
- Patient has failed an adequate trial<sup>^</sup> of or patient has an allergy or intolerance\* to naratriptan, sumatriptan, and rizatriptan.
