Esomeprazole Suspension Packets (Nexium Suspension)

Notes:

- Quantity Limits: Yes
- ^Adequate trial is defined as 14-day treatment duration
- *Intolerance excludes adverse drug reactions that are expected, mild in nature, resolve with continued treatment, and do not require medication discontinuation
- **If requested esomeprazole dose is 10 mg per dose, or if patient has a feeding tube, trial of omeprazole oral disintegrating tablets (over-the-counter product) NOT required

Initiation (new start) criteria, criteria for *current Kaiser Permanente members* already taking the medication who have not been reviewed previously, and criteria for *new members* entering Kaiser Permanente already taking the medication who have not been reviewed previously:

Non-formulary **esomeprazole suspension packets (Nexium Suspension)** will be covered on the prescription drug benefit when the following criteria are met:

- Patient is not currently swallowing any other medications in capsule/tablet form (only approved for patients unable to swallow solid dosage forms)
- Patient has failed an adequate trial[^] of lansoprazole 3 mg/mL suspension or patient has an allergy or intolerance* to lansoprazole suspension
- If ordered esomeprazole dose is over 10 mg per dose AND patient does not have a feeding tube, patient must also fail an adequate trial[^] of omeprazole oral disintegrating tablets (over-the-counter product)** OR patient has an allergy or intolerance* to omeprazole oral disintegrating tablets
- Patient has failed an adequate trial[^] of lansoprazole oral disintegrating tablets (overthe-counter product) OR patient has an allergy or intolerance^{*} to lansoprazole oral disintegrating tablets

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
