Non-Formulary **opicapone (Ongentys)** requires a clinical review. Appropriateness of therapy will be based on the following criteria:

Initiation (new start) criteria, criteria for *current Kaiser Permanente members* already taking the medication who have not been reviewed previously: Non-

Formulary **opicapone (Ongentys)** will be covered on the prescription drug benefit for <u>12</u> <u>months</u> when the following criteria are met:

- Prescribed by a neurologist
- Patient has a diagnosis of Parkinson's disease
- Patient is experiencing at least 2-hours "off" time per day despite maximally tolerated levodopa/carbidopa
- Patient has failed an adequate trial of, or patient has an allergy or intolerance to:
 - Entacapone AND
 - An MAO-B inhibitor (selegiline, rasagiline) OR a dopamine agonist (ropinirole, pramipexole)

<u>Criteria for new members entering Kaiser Permanente already taking the</u> <u>medication who have not been reviewed previously</u>: Non-Formulary opicapone (Ongentys) will be covered on the prescription drug benefit for <u>12 months</u> when the following criteria are met:

- Patient has a diagnosis of Parkinson's disease
- Patient has failed an adequate trial of, or patient has an allergy or intolerance to:
 - Entacapone AND
 - An MAO-B inhibitor (selegiline, rasagiline) OR a dopamine agonist (ropinirole, pramipexole)

<u>Continued use criteria for patients previously approved per the above criteria who</u> <u>are currently stable on the medication</u>: Non-Formulary **opicapone (Ongentys)** will continue to be covered on the prescription drug benefit for <u>12 months</u> when the following criteria are met:
