Tapinarof 1% Cream (Vtama)

Notes:

- Quantity Limits: Yes
- ^Adequate trial is defined as 8 weeks treatment duration
- *Intolerance excludes adverse drug reactions that are expected, mild in nature, resolve with continued treatment, and do not require medication discontinuation

Initiation (new start) criteria, criteria for current Kaiser Permanente members already taking the medication who have not been reviewed previously, and criteria for new members entering Kaiser Permanente already taking the medication who have not been reviewed previously: Non-formulary tapinarof 1% cream (Vtama) will be covered on the prescription drug benefit for 12 months when the following criteria are met:

- Prescriber is a dermatologist
- Patient has a diagnosis of plague psoriasis
- Patient is 18 years of age or older
- Patient has failed an adequate trial[^], or patient has an allergy or intolerance^{*} to all
 of the following:
- At least 2 topical steroids
- o At least 1 topical vitamin D analog (e.g.,calcitriol ointment, calcipotriene solution)
- o At least 1 topical calcineurin inhibitor (e.g. tacrolimus 0.1% ointment)
- Phototherapy (unless documented by prescriber phototherapy not appropriate)

Continued use criteria for patients previously approved per the above criteria who are currently stable on the medication: Non-formulary tapinarof 1% cream (Vtama) will continue to be covered on the prescription drug benefit for 12 months when the following criteria are met:

- Prescriber is a dermatologist
- Patient has responded to tapinar of 1% cream as determined by prescriber

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
