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**Important Announcement:
Recall of Lidocaine 4% (40 mg/ml) Topical Solution by Teligent**

Dear Kaiser Permanente Member,

You may be affected by a recent recall of **Lidocaine 4% topical solution** manufactured by **Teligent** Pharmaceuticals.

If you are no longer taking this medication or no longer have a supply of this medication, please ignore this letter. If you have a supply of this medication, here is what you need to know about this recall.

Why is Teligent recalling this medication?

- **Teligent** announced the recall because four lots (batches) of this medication were found to be super potent, meaning that use of the medication could result in a higher than intended lidocaine dose.

How do I know if my medication is affected by this recall?

- To determine whether your medication is affected by this recall, you will need to locate the lot number and expiration date printed on the **bottle**.
- The lot numbers and expiration dates for the recalled lots are:
 - Lot Number: **13262** Expiration Date: **03/2022**
 - Lot Number: **14217** Expiration Date: **08/2022**
 - Lot Number: **13058** Expiration Date: **02/2022**
 - Lot Number: **13768** Expiration Date: **05/2022**
- If your **bottle** is printed with any of the lot numbers and expiration dates listed above, please bring your medication with this letter to the pharmacy that fills your prescriptions at your earliest convenience.
- The pharmacy will exchange your recalled medication with medication that is not affected by this recall **at no charge**.
- If you cannot locate the lot number and expiration date, please bring your **bottle** to the pharmacy where you normally fill your prescriptions. The pharmacist can identify whether your medication has been affected by this recall.

What should I do if my medication is *not* from the recalled lot?

- If your **bottle** is **not** from the recalled lot, your medication is **not** affected by the recall and you may continue to use your medication.
