VISITOR POLICY HOSPITALS

Visitor requirements:

- A visitor badge must be worn to be allowed into care areas.
- Visitors entering the building agree they've been free from the following symptoms for the last 24 hours:
 - Fever or chills
 - Cough
 - Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
 - Fatigue
 - Muscle or body aches
 - Headache
 - New loss of taste or smell
 - Sore throat
 - Congestion or runny
 nose
 - Nausea or vomiting
 - Diarrhea
- Masks must be worn at all times.
- Visitor must be age 8 or older.
- Visitor eating/drinking is limited to the hospital cafeteria and/or designated areas.

Restrictions vary by facility type and circumstances. Please read the exceptions to the right.

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- Single occupancy rooms are allowed two visitors at a time.
- Double occupancy rooms are allowed one visitor at a time.
- One visitor is allowed in pre-op and post-op care areas to receive instructions.

Additional visitors allowed:

- Language interpreter (certified language interpreters only).
- Spiritual care once a day.
- A Doula for laboring patients.
- Patients with disabilities may have a support person in care areas. A support person policy is available for additional information.

All visitors must respect hospital quiet hours from 9 p.m. to 5 a.m. and must meet hospital visitor requirements. See registration for questions regarding the visitor policy.
